Academic Policy

The University of Charleston-Beckley Radiologic Technology Program is a seventeen month program consisting of a total of three semesters and two summer sessions. Students are evaluated didactically by program faculty based upon established evaluation criteria, as outlined in each course syllabus. A minimum of a 2.5 grade point average must be maintained throughout the entire course of study. Students must maintain a grade of "C" or higher in all RADT, required supporting course work, and pre-requisite courses.

Clinical setting evaluation is conducted by Clinical Instructors and the Clinical Coordinator of the Radiologic Technology Program, based upon student performance. Grades are based upon weekly evaluations, exam competency testing, and clinical rotation evaluations, as outlined in each clinical syllabus. Students must maintain a grade of "C" or higher in every clinical rotation.

Failure to meet the requirements in the above policy will result in dismissal from the program as outlined in the Academic Dismissal Policy.

The student will receive a midterm report only if he/she is performing at the "D" or "F" level in a course.

Didactic and clinical evaluations are based on the following grading scale:

A = 93 - 100% B = 85 - 92% C = 77 - 84%

D = 69 - 76%

F = 68% and below I = Incomplete

Academic Honors

Every student who earns a Grade Point Average of 3.50 or higher for a regular schedule of courses consisting of 12 or more credits, with nine credits or more or regular letter grades, i.e., no "P," "I," or "AU," will be recognized on the Dean's List at the end of each semester.
