Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act





What is FERPA?

- FERPA is a federal law, also known as the Buckley Amendment
- Protects the privacy of a student's educational records
- Applies to all schools that receive federal funding (e.g. financial aid)
- It is enforced by the

What is an Educational Record?

Any record, with certain exceptions, maintained by an institution that is directly related to a student.

- **D**Exams
- ☐ Transcripts
- Graded papers
- □Notes from a conversation with a student
- □Computer screen displaying student information
- ☐ Email containing information about a student





Directory Information

Information not generally considered to be an invasion of privacy if disclosed

Directory Information:

- Student name, address & telephone number
- Email address
- Date/place of birth
- Major field of study
- Participation in officially recognized activities
- Height and weight of athletic team members
- Dates of attendance
- Degrees Awarded
- Most recent school attended

NOT Directory Information:

- Race
- Ethnicity
- Gender
- Citizenship
- Religion
- UC ID or SSN (full or partial)
- Grades
- GPA
- Class Schedule





FERPA applies to a student at UC as of the student's first day of class and stays in effect from that point forward.





Student Permission

- Each student is given the choice to complete a FERPA Disclosure form.
- The student must check which areas they wish to include in the release.
- The student must list the person(s) they want to authorize.
- The student has the right to change the FERPA Disclosure form at any time.

Under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the University of Charleston is permitted to disclose information from your education records to your parent if they claim you as a dependent for federal tax purposes.

Parental Authentication

We must identify and authenticate the identity of parents -- who claim their child as a dependent or who have a student who has signed a waiver -- before disclosing educational records.





Exceptions to the Consent Rule

Schools may disclose education records to parents if:

- * the student is a dependent for income tax purposes;
- * a health or safety emergency involves their son or daughter;
- * the student is under age 21 and has violated any law or school policy concerning the use or possession of alcohol or a controlled substance.





Student Rights

UC will provide annual notification to students of their right to:

- Inspect and review their educational records
- Request an amendment to their educational records
- Request that their directory information not be disclosed
- File a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education
