The decision to have their wedding ceremony in the chapel in Riggelman Hall (the room that now houses the president's office) was partly driven by economics - the chapel and minister were free.

The wedding was small, and they headed to Chillicothe, OH that evening for the honeymoon. "One of the most memorable parts of the evening was the car. We didn't have a car growing up, so I had not learned to drive yet. But when I graduated from Ohio University and we were getting married, I thought Norma deserved to have a nice car. I couldn't drive it and I went into debt to get it, but I bought a 1955 Jaguar Sedan. It was black with red leather interior and a walnut dash. Norma is the one who taught me to drive."


