Students who participate in fall sports began moving back to campus last week as they prepare for their upcoming seasons. It is always energizing to have more campus activity and see students' excitement for another school year. Meanwhile,

over 1,700 students are nearing the end of their Summer semester classes. While most of them are enrolled in online courses, they are getting the same high-touch, high-impact experience so many of you enjoyed as UC students.

Over the summer we completed various projects including the football locker room renovation, residence hall upgrades, and the installation of new branding and graphics. Our new Provost, School of Business Dean, and School of Leadership Dean began in their new roles in July, and several new faculty will be bringing their expertise to our students. Our Master of Occupational Therapy program launches this fall, and we are working through the accreditation process for a new Doctor of Physical Therapy program in 2026. Undergraduate students can start now at UC and transition into these great healthcare programs after completing their bachelor degrees. Meanwhile, I am happy to report that our most recent bachelor degree in nursing, radiological science, and master of physician assistant graduates achieved 100% pass rates on their licensure exams!

That is why our first-year retention, the percentage of students that begin their college studies at UC who return for their second year, is at an all-time high.

Betty's Beanie

My name is Elizbeth Spence Daugherty, but I've always been called Betty. I attended, and graduated from, what was then Morris Harvey College, now the University of Charleston. My freshman year at Morris Harvey was 1961-1962, after graduating from South Charleston High School in 1961.

I had hardly been out of West Virginia when I came to Morris Harvey, so it was quite heady for me to meet so many young people from so many places. The gathering place for students was called the Igloo, a snack bar with light food. We met, studied, and played cards and games in the booths around the room, it was a happy place. I was also a member

Friday, November 22, 1963, stands out to all Americans as that was the day President Kennedy was assassinated. It was such a shock when the news spread quickly through the Igloo, and we had no school for days following the event. I was actually at home in South Charleston, watching TV with my mother when Jack Ruby shot Lee Harvey Oswald.

Some of the friends I made at Morris Harvey remained my friends throughout the rest of our lives. Some have passed now, but memories remain. So, something so small and commonplace as a beanie can bring back so many memories. I have sent it back to campus in hopes that it can bring a smile to current students.

After graduating from Morris Harvey, I married Sylvan Daugherty (Butch) in 1965. We moved to Maryland, I taught school for thirty years, and still live in Berlin, MD (near Ocean City).

"I graduated UC on Derby Day of 2002 and that fall, I arrived in New York and was part of a nine-student cohort that was admitted to the Brooklyn College MFA Arts Management Program. I had classes at the Brooklyn Academy of Music (BAM), Second Stage Theatre, The Nederlander Group, and The Frankle-Baruch-Viertel-



Roth Group, the production companies who were, at that time, producing *Hairspray* and *Lion King*. It was a wonderful experience."

Stephen is now the Coordinator of Community Affairs for New York Presbyterian Brooklyn Methodist Hospital. "We do about 300 in person and virtual events per year, impacting about 20,000 folks in Brooklyn and around New York City. "At the heart of it, I just like being a person that creates space for people to get the information they need to feel empowered and to be heard."

Professionally, Stephen defines himself as a musician and public health advocate, because while his work in health has the greatest impact, his music continues to be the most authentic representation of who he is as a person. "Since 2007, I have been creating music from my heart and life experiences, with an intention of sharing joy and power."

He has released thirty original songs, a few EPs, a couple of albums and at least 200 performances ranging from open mic nights to large outdoor festivals. He appeared twice on "Showtime at the Apollo" and his music has been featured on films, television, media campaigns and in podcasts, including several NPR podcasts.
