With the ever-changing landscape of the University of Charleston, innovative ideas have grown at the center of the capitol of West Virginia, literally. With the addition of the UC Downtown Innovation Hub (DIH), local businesses are getting the helping hand they need.

Discovering the Hidden Gems of Innovation

The DIH provides a business accelerator to help people with a business idea if they do not know where to go from there. They also help with businesses seeking growth. However, they must meet certain flexible requirements such as being in operation for more than one year, having at least one employee other than the founder(s), and having a minimum of \$250k in revenue during the prior year. This helps the Business Accelerator Program know that they are already an established business.





The DIH is located at 240 Capitol Street in the Downtown Charleston Historic District, and they are open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Unbeknownst to many, this project started in September of 2019 when the first discussion occurred about how the space could be used to benefit both UC and the Charleston community. In May 2020, the Market Assessment and Feasibility Study for the business accelerator concept kicked off. After that, in May of 2021 a feasibility study was completed which started the proposed development to fund the project through the U.S. Economic **Development Administration** (USEDA). In May of 2022, UC received a USEDA grant award to fund the DIH to prove the concept of the Business Accelerator Program and its other initiatives. During Fall 2022 and Spring 2023, renovation of the facility began. In July of 2023, the DIH officially opened.

Many students have seen or heard of this new downtown campus addition, but what is it? The DIH is an extension of the campus with rooms available for students to study, but it is not the building's focus. It is a business-focused platform for the university. There will be future opportunities for students to get internships to help the interests of local businesses.

The DIH has many businesses within their cohort, such as Gresham Plumbing, which is a family-owned business that has been providing Charleston with their services since 1937. The Donut Connection is also a client, and they just changed ownership to Teresa Ortiz, a 20-yearold from South Carolina who acquired the shop from a family friend.

Although much of the DIH is directed toward the business landscape, with the many partners DIH has, they will be able to connect students who are looking to start their own businesses and provide guidance to them. The DIH also holds events like the ArtWalk, giving local artists and UC students an opportunity to display their art in any medium. They are also looking to help with other events around the city that the community and students are interested in. Students are also invited to every event such as workshops, speakers, and panels free of charge. However, The **Business Accelerator Program is** there to help many local businesses reach their full potential.



College campus food can be tricky to balance, especially as an on-campus resident and athlete. Here at the University of Charleston (UC), the cafeteria has several options that you can mix and match to strive for a better diet. There are also some tips and tricks for dormitory meals that are tasty and nutritious while complying with the health and safety rules of your residence hall.

Let's start with the basics of a balanced diet for athletes. A healthy diet consists of roughly equal amounts of protein and fat with a good amount of carbs. According to the Better Health Channel, an athlete's diet should be 45-65% carbohydrates, 15-25% protein, and 20-35% fats. Protein, fat, and carbohydrates are all types of macronutrients commonly referred to as macros. Protein is essential for several functions of the body, specifically, muscle maintenance and recovery. Fat contains nutrients your body needs, but too much of this increases the risk of heart disease and obesity. Carbs are what give your body the energy it needs to function. All of these put together in healthy amounts make for a fulfilling diet.

How can students put this knowledge to use in the cafeteria?

Have a look at each of the food stations, and take note of which type of macro is being served in each dish. You'll want to dedicate around one-quarter of your meal to protein, one-half to carbs, and the rest to vegetables, according to Harvard Health. Try to avoid taking a whole dish of pasta, or just eating fries and nuggets every day. It is difficult to know the exact numbers of nutritional information when eating at the cafeteria but starting with simple steps like this will improve your diet. You may even start to physically feel better when you cut out greasy foods.

An Air Fryer is Your Best Friend

If you do not have access to a kitchen on campus, get yourself an air fryer! Air fryers are now allowed in dorm rooms and are a great way to make healthy meals quickly. Walmart and Amazon offer some great, cheap options for air fryers ranging from \$25-\$30. Air fryers can cook meats like chicken and salmon to potatoes or vegetables like cauliflower. Chicken, for example, can take only ten minutes to cook in an air fryer. Pair that with a salad, and you have made yourself a healthy chicken salad. For vegetarian options, cauliflower is a great substitute. You can whip up some buffalo cauliflower by adding just a few other ingredients. 



The "experience" section is a way to show your audience a timeline of your experience so far. Use 2-3 sentences that explain your most impressive accomplishments in jobs or internships thus far in your professional career.



There is a section labeled "ask for recommendations" that gives your past bosses, mentors, or colleagues a place to exemplify why you are the best candidate.



"LinkedIn helped me build connections during such a crucial time to do so. They have a jobs tab that makes it easy to specifically filter for what job you are looking for," said Metzger."






University of Charleston's Cross Country Team Continues Dominance By: Rebecca Mago
