DR. THOMAS MENIGHAN

Dr. Thomas E. Menighan is a prominent figure in the pharmaceutical landscape, renowned for his leadership, innovation, and commitment to advancing the pharmacy profession. As a partner in Catizone, Luce & Menighan, he spearheads consultancy efforts aimed at enhancing pharmacy practices, technology, and regulatory compliance.

CEO Emeritus of the American Pharmacists Association (APhA) and Assistant Dean for Community Engagement at West Virginia University School of Pharmacy, Dr. Menighan's influence extends globally, with roles on the boards of the United States Pharmacopeia (USP) and the International Pharmaceutical Federation (FIP).

His dedication to patient care is evident in his founding roles in PursueCare and PursueCareRx, supporting individuals in recovery from opioid use disorder. Dr. Menighan's entrepreneurial spirit has led to the creation of multiple successful pharmaceutical ventures, spanning community pharmacy, specialty pharmacy, telehealth, and supply chain integrity.

A native of Sistersville, West Virginia, Dr. Menighan holds a pharmacy degree from West Virginia University and an MBA from Averett College. His contributions have been honored with prestigious awards, including honorary doctorate degrees from West Virginia University and the University of Charleston, along with the WVPA Bowl of Hygeia.

Dr. Menighan's journey exemplifies tireless dedication, visionary leadership, and a steadfast commitment to advancing pharmacy practice and improving patient outcomes. He continues to be a beacon of inspiration and innovation in the pharmaceutical community, leaving an indelible legacy for generations to come.

History of Hooding Ceremony and Academic Regalia

The pageantry of commencement has its roots in medieval times, dating to the early tradition of Europe's first universities. In 1895, the United States set for its universities a uniform academic costume code which is reflected in most regalia worn today.

The colorful hood is a special part of academic regalia and denotes scholarly and professional achievements. Academic hoods may be worn by those receiving the bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degrees, however they differ in length and velvet trim width according to degree awarded. The doctoral hood is the longest of the three with the inner lining denoting the institution awarding the degree. The outer velvet trim five inches in width denotes the academic discipline. University of Charleston Doctor of Pharmacy graduate hoods therefore bear an inner lining of maroon and gold with the velvet trim of olive green for pharmacy.

Gowns represent the levels of academic degrees. The doctoral gown worn by most of the faculty and doctoral candidates is faced with velvet panels from the neck to the ankles, fitted with bell-shaped sleeves crossed by three velvet bars. Although the color of the gown in the US is generally black, several universities have their own distinctive colors

The cap allows for the greatest individual expression. Worn by most is the traditional mortarboard, however velvet tams reserved for the doctoral degree are also commonly seen. The bachelor's and master's tassel match the color of the discipline. A tassel of gold thread is reserved for the doctoral cap however, the discipline color may also adorn the cap.
