campus and new programming can all be attributed to donors! Your support has helped us to impact students with scholarships, professional development and leadership experience, campus projects, program specific learning and more.



Alumnus of the Year Award

Criteria:

- Graduate of Morris Harvey College or University of Charleston
- Made significant contributions to UC and/or their community on a local, state, national, or international level through professional service, public service, or civic activities
- Demonstrates the ideals of the University's mission by living a life of productive work, enlightened living, and community involvement.
- Exceptional service in support of the advancement and continued excellence in education of the University of Charleston.

Rising Alumni Award

The award is given to honor an alumnus who is surpassing the expected standard in their field and identifiable as an emerging leader through their professional achievements and/or community involvement. This individual is proving to be an innovator with rational, modern, and well-informed ideas that will have a positive impact on the future of their professional field and/or community.

Criteria:

- Graduated from the University of Charleston within the last 15 years
- Made notable contributions to UC and/or their community on a local, state, national or international level through professional service, public service, or civic activities.
- Demonstrates the ideals of the University's mission by living a life of productive work, enlightened living, and community involvement.

Alumni who are not eligible for nomination for either award:

- Current members of the University's faculty or staff
- Currently in a position of elected or appointed government office or known to be launching a campaign
- Must be living (No Posthumous nominations)

Nominations are due to the Office of Alumni Relations by August 23rd, 2024.

A Note from our UC Athletic Director, Dr. Bren Stevens:

The Learfield Directors' Cup, also known as the NACDA Directors' Cup or simply the Directors' Cup, is an annual award given to the college or university in the United States with the most success in collegiate athletics. The National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and USA Today developed the award, which began in 1993-94 for Division I and expanded to include Division II, III, and NAIA in 1995–96. Learfield has been the title sponsor since 2008. In 2012, when I first stepped into the role of Director of Athletics, our program finished 241st out of 313 institutions in the DII Learfield Directors Cup. Unfortunately, we were sending only a couple of teams annually to NCAA post-season play. I am proud to say that for the third year in a row, UC Athletics has made it into the Top 20, and this year, we

broke into the Top 10 with a seventh-place finish.

While finishing in 7th place out of 308 NCAA II institutions is most impressive, we are only successful with the support of everyone on campus, including our faculty, staff, administration, and students. I am also incredibly proud of our coaches, athletic trainers, support staff, and the Athletic Admin. team, who care for our student-athletes with big hearts and who spend a great deal of time away from their families to ensure that we can provide an excellent experience for our athletes. A big shout out to everyone who has supported our athletes and coaches, and we have immense gratitude for your love, empathy, and passion.
