A Full Golden Eagle Athletics Report

Football: Yesterday, Coach Quinn Sander's team was ranked #6 in the AFCA National poll. This is the highest ranking of any UC or Morris Harvey football team. Our guys continue to enjoy a perfect 9-0 season after shutting down the Hilltoppers of West Liberty 38-0 on Saturday. Next up is a road trip to WV Wesleyan on Saturday and then your Golden Eagles return home for a crosstown match up with WV State. Quinn's team is ranked first in the Atlantic Super Region, which

means if we continue to win out, we will be in a position to host NCAA games and will be featured on ESPN+.

M. Soccer: Dan Smee's squad returned from Frostburg this weekend with another win over the Bobcats (3-0). Our men's soccer team boasts an impressive record of 16-0-1 and are 13-0 in MEC competitions. Our team faces a tough challenge when they travel to Concord University on Wednesday. Concord is one of the few schools in the country that still play on a grass field. Coach Smee's squad will receive a bye in the first game of the MEC tournament and should host a semi-final game the following Wednesday.

W. Soccer: Coach Sarah Leiby's team has won their last 8 games on the pitch. They defeated Concord on Sunday 4-2 at the Welch Athletic Complex. Sarah and her squad have amassed an impressive 14-3 and 13-1 record to date. They face crosstown rival, WV State on Wednesday at 7:00 pm at home to wrap up the regular season. MEC Tournament play will commence on Sunday against either West Liberty or Wheeling at 7:00 pm. As a brand-new head coach, Sarah has been masterful at preparing her team to play high-level soccer.

W. Volleyball: Congratulations to Coach Tyler Kanelos as he locked in his 100th victory as a head coach on Saturday. Tyler became a head coach for the first time when he was hired in 2021 to lead your Golden Eagles. His team has an impressive 21-6 overall record and are 9-2 in league play. On Friday night they defeated the Cardinals from Wheeling (3-1) which was another significant win for the program. Your Golden Eagles will play at home this Friday at 2:00 pm against Concord University. Please note the earlier playing time as we are also hosting men's basketball games on this same day.

M. and W. Cross Country: Nick Bias and his teams will travel to the campus of Lockhaven University for the NCAA Atlantic Regionals on Saturday. The top three teams that finish in this regional event will then have the opportunity to compete at the National Finals in Sacramento, CA. As you can see there is a lot at stake this weekend for our tremendously talented runners.

M. Basketball: This weekend you will have the opportunity to see two of our new head coaches make their debuts on the hardwood. Coach James Long and his

squad will start the season off with a tough regional match up against CAL PA. Our guys will take to the floor this Friday evening at 7:00 pm in the HB Wehrle Arena.

W. Basketball: Many of you may remember Coach Bubby Johnson from his time a few years ago as one of our assistant coaches for the women's basketball program. On Saturday, Bubby will make his debut as the new head coach for UC Women's Basketball when his squad faces the Rams from Shepherd University at 5:30 pm. Bubby's positive demeanor and vast basketball knowledge should prove helpful as the squad begins the season with some tough regional match ups.

UC Signs Agreement with Mongolian University

At a signing ceremony on Tuesday, October 29, the University of Charleston (UC) and the Mongolian University of Science and Technology (MUST) formalized an agreement allowing MUST students to study at the UC Charleston campus. A six-person delegation from MUST and the Mongolian Embassy visited UC to sign the agreement and tour the campus. A reception was held following the signing ceremony.

Through the agreement, Mongolian University students can complete the final year of their MUST degree at UC while earning a UC business certificate, then

enroll in and earn a UC Master of Business Administration (MBA) or Master of Science in Business and Data Analytics (MSBDA) degree.

The Mongolian Embassy to the United States encouraged Mongolian Universities to develop international cooperations in higher education, noting that the University of Charleston has robust business, analytics, cybersecurity, leadership, and entrepreneurship programs – all programs of interest to MUST students.

The Mongolian University of Science in Technology was founded in 1959 as part of the National University of Mongolia. In 1982, the university was reorganized into an independent university. MUST has 12 affiliated schools that offer business, engineering, technology, education, social work, and public service and management undergraduate and graduate degree programs. The University of Charleston recently reached enrollment of 3,000 students across its Charleston campus, Beckley location, and online programs. It has also recently established two-year to four-year degree pathway partnerships with several West Virginia Community & Technical Colleges, including Mountwest, New River, and Southern. Also enrolled in UC programs are hundreds of West Virginia first responders and municipal workers who are earning certificates that can be applied toward educational degrees.
