


its first-ever Mobility Friendly Night for the display.



During Homecoming this past fall, Brad shared with us the story of his lost and found class ring. This is the perfect feel good story we all need during the holidays. I graduated from UC in May of 1989 and played soccer all four years under coach David Carr. In my senior year, I lived in Cobb Hall along with three teammates Toni Aranha (Nassau, Bahamas), Todd Robinson (Pittsburgh, PA), and Doug Coffey (Columbus/Grove City, OH).

Being only the second person on my father's side of the family to graduate from college, my grandparents graciously decided to pay for my class ring. Unfortunately, shortly after receiving it and prior to graduation, it disappeared. Not long after its disappearance, I was going back home to visit my grandparents for the Easter weekend.

I can remember feeling so terrible about losing the ring. I couldn't bear to tell them it was gone, so when I was asked by my grandmother to see the ring, I just said, "I forgot to pack it and I need to get it resized," the latter was true. I hoped this excuse would buy some time and enable me to still find the ring.

Unfortunately, graduation came and I returned home to Maryland to figure out my career life without the ring.

Flash forward twenty or so years after graduation, I received a call from the UC Alumni Relations Office asking me if I lost my class ring. I immediately answered in an emphatic "yes" followed by asking how it was found. It seems it must have fallen from my dresser or end table and lodged itself between the heater and wall. When Cobb Hall was being demolished, it was found by two of the university staff members working in the building. It was immediately turned over to Alumni Relations who then used the graduation date



and initials inside the ring to track me down. Within a few days, the ring was delivered to my home and it's never been lost again. My grandparents passed before the ring was returned to me, I can't help but think they had a hand in the recovery.

Needless to say my faith in honesty and humanity perseveres and I made sure everyone was treated to a nice lunch out on me. Most people are good and want to help you. This is especially true at UC where professors gave out their home phone numbers to their students. Since graduation, I've been able to travel all over the US and even out of the country; however, Charleston and UC is still a special place that feels like home to not only me, but my teammates.

Moral of the story - make sure the Office of Alumni has your current information, you never know what you may get in the mail!
