*I will* assess my personal capabilities and limitations, striving always to improve my medical practice.

*I will* actively seek to expand my knowledge and skills, keeping abreast of advances in medicine.

*I will* work with other members of the health care team to provide compassionate and effective care of patients.

*I will* use my knowledge and experience to contribute to an improved community.

*I will* respect my professional relationship with the physician.

I will share and expand knowledge within the profession.

These duties are pledged with sincerity and upon my honor.

## - SIGNIFICANCE OF THE WHITE COAT

The coat is white as a representation of purity and goodness; it is a visual reminder of a Physician Assistant student's dedication and commitment to the community. The White Coat Ceremony was created by the Arnold P. Gold Foundation of New York and the first ceremony was held for the entering class of the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Columbia University on August 20, 1993. The foundation feared technology and science were rapidly advancing in such a way that medical practitioners would no longer have a focus on humanism in medicine. One main reason the Foundation created the White Coat Ceremony for first year students was their belief that it is the opportunity to influence the standards of professionalism. Since then, many other health professional programs have adopted the custom.

Kevin has extensive experience in emergency and internal medicine and proudly serves on the West Virginia State Trauma Advisory Council as an At-Large Member representing Advance Practice Professionals in the state. He continues to maintain certification in Advanced Trauma Life Support and is a leader among his peers in trauma care.

Kevin enjoys teaching and has accepted students from various medical programs for more than 20 years and is proud that he has helped to establish core values in students now practicing across the United States. He is a past Student Preceptor of the Year from the West Virginia Rural Health Education Partnership. He has also been an Advanced Cardiac Life Support and Pediatric Advanced Life Support Instructor for most of his career.

Kevin currently practices at Boone Memorial Health in Madison, West Virginia, where he serves in various roles including Advance Practice Provider Supervisor and continues to enjoy direct patient care in Internal and Emergency Medicine. He works closely with other health care providers including his wife, Kathy who is a Nurse Practitioner and one of his greatest role models.
