I am particularly proud that every member of the UC Board of Trustees contributed to this important initiative that will help address the critical need for rehabilitation services in the Kanawha Valley, state, and region.





Stella Cooksey was mentioned more than anyone else, friends embraced after a forty-year absence, and many promised to be in Charleston this September for Homecoming.



special, and I've got the pictures to prove it! Be sure to check out our Facebook and Instagram pages to see more from the trip—and maybe spot someone you know who joined the fun.


















# Which Golden Eagles received a Golden Watch?


Our conversations at the reunion led to Rick and Betsy submitting the following photos and memories from the Closing of


the King event that took place in February of 2015.


