
enlightened living and community service continue to inspire everyone here at the University of Charleston.

McCann-Coles is just the second University of Charleston student to advance to the Rhodes Scholar finalist stage, joining Ryan Moran, who reached this level in 2012.





Kelton Boblits '25

A proud Golden Eagle, Kelton Boblits graduated from the University of Charleston this past spring with a double major in business management (entrepreneurship concentration) and political science (public policy concentration).

Originally from Fayetteville, West Virginia, Kelton attended UC as a Presidential Scholar and immersed himself in campus life throughout his undergraduate experience.

Kelton demonstrated exceptional leadership as a student, serving two terms as Student Government Association President and President of the Innovation Scholars. He was also an active member of the Student Activities Board and participated in multiple honor societies, including Gamma Beta Phi and Pi Gamma Mu.

In his final semester, Kelton was awarded the prestigious Herndon Fellowship, completing a legislative internship with the West Virginia State Senate. Following graduation, he continued to expand his professional experience through an internship with the West Virginia Division of Economic Development.

Kelton has returned to UC to pursue his Master of Business Administration, set to complete in Spring 2027. He chose to continue his education at UC because of the strong mentorship and support he received as an undergraduate, sharing that UC professors "go above and beyond for their students."

Dedicated to the UC mission pillar of Community Involvement, Kelton serves as President of the UC Lions Club. Most recently, he led a resource bag initiative providing food, water, socks, and a community resource guide for individuals experiencing homelessness in Charleston.

Outside of his academic and service commitments, Kelton enjoys making music around town with fellow Golden Eagle and current Presidential Scholar, Tiago "James" Romano. The duo performs together as *The Two Roommates*.

Kelton also joined the UC Office of Advancement & Alumni Relations staff in August 2025. "Working as a Graduate Assistant in the Office of Advancement has allowed me to pursue my MBA while developing practical skills in fundraising, event coordination, and connecting people around a shared mission. This experience is preparing me for the career I want to have and is shaping me into the kind of leader I aspire to



be: one that uplifts and strengthens Appalachian communities through leadership, economic development, and meaningful service."

Through his own experiences and close relationships within the UC community, he has witnessed the meaningful impact of the UC Student Supply Fund. Inspired to give back, he recently launched his first fundraising campaign to support this initiative. His goal is to ensure that no student must choose between focusing on their education and accessing basic necessities—empowering every Golden Eagle to reach their full potential. Ready to Return as a UC student like Kelton?

If you are considering a graduate degree, UC now offers a tuition discount for our alumni. The discount is 20% off the published tuition for the selected degree program.

The following UC graduate degrees are eligible for the discount: Master of Business Administration (MBA),
Master of Business and Data
Analytics, Master of Science –
Strategic Leadership, Master of



Science – Cybersecurity, Master of Science in Nursing – Family Nurse Practitioner, and the Doctor of Executive Leadership (DEL).

Students must have earned a degree from the University of Charleston and be admitted to one of the approved graduate degrees to be eligible for the discount. The discount cannot be combined with any other tuition discounts (e.g. military/law enforcement discount, etc.) with the exception of athletic scholarships. Fall 2025 Golden Eagle Athletics Updates:


Women's Volleyball- Coach Adam Hamad's squad enters the match with an impressive 18-11 overall record and is currently tied for first place in the MEC standings with an 9-3 conference mark. Come out to support our team as they battle for the top spot, they will complete their home game schedule on November 11th at 7:00 pm.

Football- QB Matt Frye and the rest of the Golden Eagle football squad rolled past WV Wesleyan last week with an impressive 69-15 victory! The team returns home this Saturday at 1:00 pm to take on West Liberty University. Coach Tesch's group enters the matchup with a strong 6-3 overall record and a 5-1 mark in MEC play, sitting tied with Frostburg State heading into the weekend.

Women's Soccer-Coach Sarah Leiby's squad holds an impressive 8-7-3 overall record and a 7-5-3 mark in MEC competition, currently sitting at #3 in the South Division standings. The Golden Eagles will then hit the road to Frostburg on Sunday for a 1:00 p.m. MEC First Round matchup. Let's wish them the best as they begin their postseason journey!

Cross Country- The Men secured another MEC Championship! Nick Bias, MEC Coach of the YEAR, and his teams will travel to Lockhaven, PA to attend the NCAA Atlantic Regional. 
